Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows how to support children's learning and development. She understands how to monitor this development and plan activities to support their individual needs and interests, to help prepare children for their future learning.
- The childminder understands her duty to safeguard children and protect them from harm. She has a clear safeguarding procedure and knows how to refer concerns. She has completed training that supports her understanding of wider safeguarding issues. The childminder holds a recognised paediatric first-aid qualification.
- The childminder's home is suitable for children's care. She offers a broad range of resources to support children's learning and development across all areas of the early years foundation stage.
- The childminder is able to explain how to support children to be independent. She understands how to manage children's behaviour, teaching them to share and be kind to each other. The childminder knows the importance of helping children to become emotionally ready for their move to school.
- The childminder knows how to support healthy lifestyles and children's physical well-being, for example promoting their understanding of healthy choices.
- The childminder understands how to encourage positive attitudes to support children to feel valued and to help them learn to respect others.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
