Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder demonstrates secure knowledge of safeguarding issues and how to keep children safe from harm. She is aware of the different signs and symptoms of abuse, and the procedure to follow should she have any concerns about a child in her care. The childminder has undertaken regular training courses and research to keep her knowledge fresh and up to date.
- Through discussion and documentation, the childminder shows her understanding of the early years framework and how children learn. She provides detailed information about activities for children to progress their learning and development. For example, consideration is given to providing children with entertaining opportunities to enjoy physical and social play.
- The childminder has a clear strategy for promoting positive behaviour and attitudes. She has clear routines in place and makes plans for children's changing understanding and influences. For instance, the factors that could effect children as they transition between schools and environments.
- A good menu of healthy food is planned for by the childminder. This, partnered with opportunities for daily fresh air, supports children's well-being and physical growth.
- Partnerships with parents and other early years providers are well managed. Detailed information is gathered to support the childminder in providing opportunities that support children's interests and needs.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
