## Summary of key findings

### This provision meets requirements

- The childminder demonstrates a secure understanding of how to safeguard children and has arrangements in place to assure their safety. He and his co-childminder are alert to the potential risks posed to children, and he promotes the safe use of technology. The childminder knows what action to take and who to report to if he has concerns about a child or if an allegation is made against him or a family member.
- The childminder and his co-childminder plan to obtain initial and ongoing information from parents about what children know and can do. He knows how to implement appropriate activities using children's interests and support them to join in activities. He explains how he intends to share information about children's progress with parents. He describes how he would involve parents if children need extra help with their learning and development.
- The childminder describes how he intends to help children acquire positive social skills, such as through group games and visits to local groups. He completes training to enhance his understanding of how to support children's emotional well-being. He explains how he would support children to develop and maintain healthy lifestyles, such as through providing varied and nutritious meals.
- The childminder recognises the importance of establishing effective partnerships with others who may be involved in children's care, such as school teaching staff. He describes how he would share relevant information and work with other professionals when necessary.
- The childminder and his co-childminder maintain links with local advisers and practitioners. This helps them to review and develop their service.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
