

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the 'Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage', which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right. On 5 February 2020, we received concerns that this provider was not meeting some of these requirements. The provider also made a notification to us about some of the concerns raised. On 12 March 2020, we carried out an unannounced visit to the provider to assess whether the provider was meeting the requirements.

Following our visit, we issued the provider with a Notice to Improve. This is a notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Action needed by 1 June 2020:

- ensure there is a suitable person in place who is capable and appropriately qualified to take charge in the absence the manager to ensure consistently good practice is adhered to
- ensure appropriate records are maintained to support all children's safety and welfare
- ensure the routines and premises are organised in a way to meet the needs of all children including the arrangements for caring for children under two years and meeting the needs of children who are learning English as an additional language
- implement effective risk assessments across all areas where children are present, taking into account tripping hazards and the storage of medication.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply

with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years commencing on the date we complete our investigation.
