As at the previous inspection, the proprietor had ensured that the standards in these paragraphs are likely to be met.

- The proprietor and headteacher have purchased the resources that staff will need to support teaching. These resources include materials to support the teaching of English, mathematics and the wider curriculum.
- Extensive building work has been carried out on the former garage. This work has been completed to provide pupils with a classroom that is fit for purpose. Furniture is now in place in the school, as are computers.
- The proprietor has ensured that the standard relating to resources in this part is likely to be met.

- The school's safeguarding policy is detailed and thorough. It has regard to the most recent guidance from the government. In drawing up this policy, leaders have considered such matters as the context of the proposed school.

- The proprietor has established systems for checking the suitability of staff in the proposed school. Some staff have already been appointed in anticipation of the school's opening. Leaders have made all necessary checks on these members of staff and have recorded them on their electronic register.
- The members of the proprietorial body have had relevant checks made. These have indicated that they are not disqualified from working within the proposed school.
- Leaders have ensured that the independent school standards in this part are likely to be met when the school opens.

Part 5. Premises of and accommodation at schools

- The former garage has undergone a refurbishment to create a classroom that is fit for purpose. Leaders are likely to be able to ensure pupils' health and safety while the premises are in use, as far as is reasonably practicable.
- The classroom is well furnished. The lighting and the acoustic conditions appear to be suitable for the needs of pupils and staff.
- There are toilet facilities and a wash basin with a supply of hot and cold water for washing. The temperature of the hot water is controlled by a central thermostat to avoid the risk of scalding. Separate drinking water supplies are available for pupils throughout the day.
- The room for providing pupils with medical attention is suitably equipped and sited near a toilet.

- This inspection was commissioned by the Department of Education (DfE) during the COVID-19 (coronavirus) pandemic of 2020. As this was the second pre-registration inspection, the lead inspector focused on evidence submitted by the school and did not make a site visit. Much of the evidence submitted by the school was linked to how the proprietor now ensured that standards found to be unmet at the previous pre-registration inspection were now met.
- This inspection was commissioned by the DfE in order to confirm whether the school was likely to meet the independent school standards and other requirements needed to operate as an independent school. This was the second pre-registration inspection of the proposed school.
- The inspector scrutinised the documents and photographs provided by the school. She also spoke to the headteacher.
- The inspector checked the school's likely compliance with the independent school standards.
