## Summary of key findings

### This provision meets requirements

- The manager and staff understand the importance of evaluating their practice. Following the last inspection, they have reflected on their provision to make changes that have a positive impact on children's experiences. For example, they have reviewed the organisation of resources to create a more cosy, comfortable area where children can relax or sit quietly.
- The manager and staff know how to support children in leading a healthy lifestyle. Children learn about the need for regular exercise, healthy eating and robust hygiene practice.
- All children can make suggestions for the planned activities or changes they would like to see at the club. Staff value their contributions and implement appropriate changes.
- The manager and staff have very good links with the school that children attend and where the club is based. Staff share information about children's interests and experiences to support continuity in their care and well-being.
- The manager and staff have a good understanding of how children learn and develop. They recognise the importance of observing children and provide a range of enjoyable activities to keep children motivated to learn. Staff adapt activities to support children's individual interests.
- All staff have a paediatric first-aid certificate and up-to-date safeguarding training. The manager and staff have a sound understanding of child protection issues and wider safeguarding matters. Staff are aware of the signs that a child might be at risk of harm either at the club or at home. Staff understand the local procedures to follow if they have concerns about a child in their care.
- Staff keep the environment clean, safe and secure. They conduct visual safety checks to minimise any hazards.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
