Acorn Children's Home (Branston) Ltd

Monitoring visit
Inspected under the social care common inspection framework

Information about this children's home

This privately owned children's home is registered to provide care for up to four children who have moved following a breakdown in either their fostering or residential placement or who are required to live away from home.

The manager was registered with Ofsted in December 2019 and holds a level 5 qualification in leadership and management. He informed inspectors that he intends to leave the organisation and to cancel his registration with Ofsted.

This monitoring visit

Ofsted completed a remote monitoring inspection on 6 May 2020. On 7 May 2020, a notice of restriction of accommodation was issued. This was because Ofsted believed that, should any further children be admitted to the home, it would place the existing child and any new children at risk of harm.

To further assess the safeguarding practices in the home, a monitoring inspection was completed on 12 May 2020. Following this visit, Ofsted continues to be concerned. The notice of restriction of accommodation remains in place. Two compliance notices have been issued to focus leaders and managers to make improvements relating to safeguarding and leadership and management practice.

A further two regulatory breaches were identified. Staff did not check the inspector's identification before she entered the home. This does not promote the safety of the child living in the home.

One member of staff has not obtained the required level 3 qualification needed to work in the home within the required time frames. This is not a widespread issue, but managers have not considered when the member of staff should complete this by.

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No issues were identified with the administration of a child's medication. However, staff re-write medication administration records when they look untidy. This is not good practice and allows the potential for records to be changed and edited.

What does the children's home need to do to improve?

Statutory requirements

This section sets out the actions that the registered person(s) must take to meet the Care Standards Act 2000, Children's Homes (England) Regulations 2015 and the 'Guide to the children's homes regulations including the quality standards'. The registered person(s) must comply within the given timescales.

Requirement	Due date
In particular, the standard in paragraph (1) requires the registered person to ensure— that staff— assess whether each child is at risk of harm, taking into account information in the child's relevant plans, and, if necessary, make arrangements to reduce the risk of any harm to the child; that the home's day-to-day care is arranged and delivered so as to keep each child safe and to protect each child effectively from harm. In particular, the standard in paragraph (1) requires the registered person to— ensure that staff have the experience, qualifications and skills to meet the needs of each child. (Regulation 13(2)(c))*	14/06/2020
For the purposes of paragraph (3)(b), an individual who works in the home in a care role has the appropriate qualification if, by the relevant date, the individual has attained— (a) the Level 3 Diploma for Residential Childcare (England) ('the Level 3 Diploma'); or (b) a qualification which the registered person considers to be equivalent to the Level 3 Diploma. The registered person must notify HMCI and each other relevant person without delay if— there is any other incident relating to a child which the registered person considers to be serious. (Regulation 40(4)(e))	14/06/2020
The registered person must ensure that an independent person visits the children's home at least once each month. (Regulation 44(1))	14/06/2020
In order to complete a quality of care review the registered person must establish and maintain a system for monitoring, reviewing and evaluating— the feedback and opinions of children about the children's home, its facilities and the quality of care they receive in it; and any actions that the registered person considers necessary in order to improve or maintain the quality of care provided for children. Recommendations

- Ensure that when a child returns to the home after being missing from care or away from the home without permission, the responsible local authority must provide an opportunity for the child to have an independent return home interview. Homes should take account of the information provided by such interviews when assessing risks and putting arrangements in place to protect each child. ('Guide to the children's homes regulations including the quality standards', page 45, paragraph 9.30)
- Please see regulation 23. Care must be taken to ensure prescribed medicines are only administered to the individual for whom they are prescribed. Medicines must be administered in line with a medically approved protocol. Records must be kept of the administration of all medication, which includes occasions when prescribed medication is refused. Regulation 23 requires the registered person to ensure that they make suitable arrangements to manage, administer and dispose of any medication. These are fundamentally the same sorts of arrangements as a good parent would make but are subject to additional safeguards. Where the home has questions or concerns about a child's medication, they should approach an expert such as a General Medical Practitioner, community pharmacist or designated nurse for looked-after children. ('Guide to the children's homes regulations including the quality standards', page 35, paragraph 7.15)

This relates to staff re-writing medication administration documents.
