Care 4 Children Residential Services Limited

Monitoring visit
Inspected under the social care common inspection framework

Information about this children's home

This privately-owned home provides medium-to long-term therapeutic care and accommodation for up to six children or young people who may have suffered childhood complex trauma. This trauma can be the culmination of physical, emotional, neglect, sexual or complex trauma, which may have associated risks, such as child sexual exploitation. The home offers planned placements for boys and girls aged between eight and 13 years of age.

Inspection date: 28 May 2020

This monitoring visit

At the full inspection on 3 and 4 February 2020, the inspectors found serious shortfalls in the safeguarding arrangements and in the leadership and management of the home. As a result, Ofsted issued two compliance notices under section 22 of the Care Standards Act 2000. These were in relation to Regulation 12 and Regulation 13. A condition was also imposed, identifying that the provider must give Ofsted three months' notice of their intention to admit any children.

In March 2020, the provider notified Ofsted that they wished to start operating the home in June 2020. This on-site inspection visit was conducted to consider this request and to assess the organisation's response to addressing the two compliance notices.

Since the last full inspection, the management team has developed a clear action plan for improvement. The actions taken to implement this plan have supported the provider to meet both the compliance notices. This action plan has formed the basis for reviewing and monitoring practice in the home and has resulted in a number of improvements. These include a review of all documentation, recruitment of a new staff team and the appointment of an experienced manager.

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The provider has taken sufficient steps to ensure that staff can identify risks and take effective action to reduce the risk of harm. The provider has implemented additional training for staff. This includes safeguarding and behaviour management training. Furthermore, a detailed training plan is now in place to ensure the continual development of staff. This will help to ensure that staff have the necessary skills, confidence and knowledge to provide safe and effective care.

The leadership and management arrangements have improved. A new manager has been appointed and he is in the process of applying to register with Ofsted. He is an experienced manager who is suitably qualified for the role. The manager is child focused and committed to delivering and maintaining good standards of care.

The responsible individual and manager acknowledged the significant failings that have been identified previously and have worked hard to achieve their action plan to rectify this.

The provider has improved and developed both the internal and external monitoring systems to ensure that there are continuous improvements in the quality of care provided at the home.

The home environment has improved greatly and now provides children with a safe, comfortable place to live. The broken windows in the games room and in one child's bedroom have now been repaired. The fuse and electrical boxes are now secure, and the broken light switches and broken fire call points have all been replaced.

An improved induction programme has been implemented in line with the provider's response to COVID-19 (coronavirus). The online induction and training programme provides staff with a range of learning opportunities for them to learn and develop their safeguarding roles and responsibilities.

The provider has improved the staff team and recruited a number of new staff. Some of these staff hold the required qualifications, and others will be supported to achieve these within the required timeframe.

The additional requirements raised at the last inspection have not been reviewed at this visit. These will be explored at the next inspection.

The effectiveness of the actions implemented by the provider has yet to be tested as there have been no children living in this home.

The provider has notified Ofsted that they intend to accept new referrals for this service, in line with their current condition of registration. Ofsted has agreed to the provider's request to amend their conditions to permit this to happen.
