

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the 'Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage', which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 20 March 2020 and 22 May 2020, we received concerns that this provider was not meeting some of these requirements. We held two telephone discussions with the provider to discuss the concerns and have issued a Welfare Requirements Notice. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

ensure appropriate strategies are used to manage children's behaviour in a positive manner, taking account of their individual needs and level of understanding

ensure risk assessments for outings are effective and identify any risks or hazards that may arise, particularly when on the school run, and identify steps to remove, minimise and manage those risks

Action required by 19 June 2020

We spoke to the provider on 22 June 2020 to monitor compliance with the Welfare Requirements Notice. We found that the provider was complying.

The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years commencing on the date we complete our investigation.
