## Summary of key findings

### This provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows how to support children's learning. She is aware of the importance of working with parents and other professionals involved with children to ensure consistency for their care and learning. The childminder knows what skills will help children when they move on to the next stage in their education. She understands how to plan activities that interest and motivate children and will support their learning. The childminder has a good range of resources that can help children's learning in all areas.
- The childminder understands how to help children develop an active lifestyle. She knows how to encourage positive behaviour and healthy choices for children. The childminder is aware of the importance of encouraging children to be independent and to develop positive attitudes to their learning. She recognises the importance of helping children learn about the wider world.
- The childminder fully understands her role to keep children safe at all times. She has a good knowledge of child protection and wider safeguarding issues, such as keeping safe online. The childminder knows the procedures to follow if she has any concerns about a child or their family. She attends regular training to keep her knowledge current.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
