

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the 'Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage', which you can find at

www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On the 25 June 2020 the provider notified Ofsted of a significant event. The notification means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the early years foundation stage welfare requirements to notify Ofsted of such instances. Although it was not part of the original concern, we found that Ofsted were not aware of the changes to the individuals who make up the registered provider. We carried out an unannounced visit on 2 July 2020 and served a Welfare Requirement Notice. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescale set out. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

Actions needed

improve staff's knowledge and understanding of the steps that they must take in the event of a serious accident involving a child by 16 July 2020

strengthen and improve the details of the health and safety policy and take steps to ensure that all staff understand and consistently implement safe practice by 16 July 2020

ensure that all staff, specifically those that hold senior posts, receive induction training to help them understand their role and responsibilities by 16 July 2020

ensure that Ofsted are provided with the relevant information in order to check the

suitability of those individuals that make up the registered provider by 16 July 2020

We carried out an unannounced visit on 17 July 2020 to monitor compliance with the welfare requirement notice. We found that the provider had taken appropriate action to meet the requirements of the EYFS. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years commencing on the date we complete our investigation.
