

## **Compliance action taken for childcare provision**

### **Summary of outcome**

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the 'Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage', which you can find at [www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2](http://www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2).

If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 29 January 2020 we carried out an inspection and found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements of the early years foundation stage. The overall effectiveness of the provision was judged to be inadequate. We served a welfare requirement notice. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take action. The inspection report sets out the actions the provider was required to take to meet the requirements.

On 13 February 2020 we visited the provider to check compliance with the actions listed in the welfare requirement notice issued at the inspection. It was found that the provider had taken action by improving the setting's vetting systems, so that people employed to work with children are suitable and that all staff receive induction training. The provider has also put appropriate arrangements in place for the supervision of staff. In addition, each child is assigned a key person and parents are informed about their child's learning experiences.

Risk assessments have improved and are carried out to ensure that children are not exposed to risks. We found that the provider has improved the premises and areas that children use and that they are now maintained to a suitable standard.

We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised at the last inspection.

The provider will be able to give parents further information about this. The provider is still

registered with Ofsted.
