

## Compliance action taken for childcare provision

## **Summary of outcome**

'All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the 'Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage', which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right. On 11 August 2020 we received concerns that this provider was not meeting some of these requirements. We have served a Welfare Requirements Notice. This is a legal

notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out. The

provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

## Actions needed

- ensure reasonable steps are taken to ensure the safety of children, staff and others on the premises in case of a fire, particularly making sure fire escapes are clear from building rubble and motor vehicles do not park in front of the fire assembly points, by 21 August 2020
- ensure staff can demonstrate all reasonable steps are taken to ensure the safety of children in your care, particularly relating to any building work taking place, by 21 August 2020.

We visited the provider on 24 August 2020. The provider had taken steps to ensure the safety of children and staff on the premises. The fire escape was free from building rubble and there were no motor vehicles parked in front of the fire assembly point. Furthermore, staff showed that all reasonable steps were being taken to ensure the safety of children in their care. The provider remains registered with Ofsted.

## **Publication of compliance action**

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the



enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years commencing on the date we complete our investigation.
