Information about this children's home

This is a privately-owned provision registered as a children's home to accommodate up to 12 children and young people with special educational needs and learning disabilities, including autism spectrum disorder.

A new manager started working in the home in May 2020 and has applied to be registered.

This monitoring visit

A monitoring visit was undertaken following concerns raised in a complaint to Ofsted. There are three children living at the home.

Managers have failed to ensure that impact risk assessments are adequately completed prior to children moving into the home. This does not ensure that children are compatible with each other or the skills of the staff team.

Risk assessments and behaviour management plans do not give the necessary guidance in managing challenging behaviours, such as biting. This places children and staff at risk of harm.

Managers have not ensured staff receive supervision in line with company policy. As a result, staff have not been able to reflect on their practice and the needs of the children.

Managers have not provided staff with the training required to meet the needs of children with autism, or those with communication or learning difficulties. Consequently, staff do not have the required knowledge and skills needed to care for the children.



Medication has not always been administered to children as prescribed. Managers and staff have acted to ensure children have not been harmed through these omissions and further training has been given to staff to prevent further occurrences.

Children are making progress, and are cared for by staff who genuinely care about them. Staff promote children's independence and engage positively with the children. Consequently, children are happy living at the home.

Ofsted has issued one compliance notice and will monitor the provider's compliance with this notice.
