## **Worcestershire Children First**

Monitoring visit

Inspected under the social care common inspection framework

### **Information about this children's home**

This home was previously owned by the local authority. It re-registered in October 2019 when the local authority moved to be a holding company. It is registered for up to eight children who have suffered adverse childhood experiences that have led to associated trauma and presenting complex behaviours, as well as for children who have learning disabilities and/or autism spectrum disorder.

The manager registered with Ofsted in October 2019 and holds a NVQ level 4 in leadership and management.

### **This monitoring visit**

On 1 and 4 May 2020, Ofsted carried out a remote monitoring inspection of the home. Following this visit, three compliance notices were issued under regulations 12, 13 and 14 of the Children's Homes (England) Regulations 2015.

On 2 and 3 June 2020, Ofsted carried out an on-site inspection to review the progress that had been made in meeting the three compliance notices. Ofsted found significant shortfalls, which resulted in Ofsted making the decision to suspend the home's registration from 5 June 2020 until 27 August 2020 and to issue a further two compliance notices.

A further monitoring visit was conducted on 15 and 16 July 2020. This found that the provider had complied with the suspension notice and had met the two compliance notices.

Ofsted carried out this inspection remotely. The inspector gathered evidence by talking to the responsible individual.

This visit found that the provider has continued to comply with the suspension notice. The provider does not plan to admit children until the senior managers action plan is fully implemented. Ofsted will keep this under review.

The remaining requirements were not assessed at the monitoring visit and will be reviewed at a future inspection.
