

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the 'Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage', which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 2 June 2020 the provider notified us of a significant event that may affect her suitability to work with children. However, the provider did not notify us in time to meet their legal responsibility as set out in the early years foundation stage welfare requirements to notify Ofsted of a significant event that may affect the suitability of anyone working with children within 14 days of the event. Following a visit to the provider we are satisfied she remains suitable and we are satisfied that she now understands when and how to notify Ofsted of such events.

The provider remains registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years.
