

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

Her Majesty's Chief Inspector of Education, Children's Services and Skills is leading Ofsted's work into how regulated early years and childcare providers in England have delivered childcentred practice and care, within the context of the restrictions placed on society during the COVID-19 (coronavirus) pandemic.

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 23 September 2020, the provider notified us of a significant event. The notification means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage.

On 25 September 2020, we carried out a regulatory telephone call to discuss the notification. We found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements and had taken action to put this right. The provider had reviewed and improved procedures for supervising children. We also discussed previous concerns and found that the provider had taken action to meet requirements in relation to the management of children's allergies and the management of accidents.

On 16 October 2020, the provider notified us of a further significant event.

On 26 October 2020, we carried out a regulatory telephone call to discuss the notification. We found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements and had taken action to put this right. The provider had reviewed and improved their procedures for conducting risk assessments.

The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

The provider remains registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply



with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years.
