

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

Her Majesty's Chief Inspector of Education, Children's Services and Skills is leading Ofsted's work into how regulated early years and childcare providers in England have delivered child-centred practice and care, within the context of the restrictions placed on society during the COVID-19 (coronavirus) pandemic.

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the [Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage](#). If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 3 May 2019, we carried out an inspection and found the provider was not meeting some of these requirements. The overall effectiveness of the provision was judged to be requires improvement. The inspection report sets out the actions the provider was asked to take to meet the requirements.

On 24 September 2020, while routine inspections were suspended, we carried out an interim visit. The focus of the visit was to check whether the provider had met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised at their last inspection.

We found that the provider has taken steps to improve staff supervision. The manager has developed an effective procedure for monitoring practice. She observes staff, provides coaching and meets with them individually to discuss the needs of children in their key group. The manager talks with staff about training needs to help them improve some aspects of their practice so that they are able to identify how they can meet children's different needs more effectively. Staff are provided with documents to record discussion points prior to attending meetings with the manager. We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare action raised.

At the visit we found a new concern. We found that the provider had failed to notify Ofsted of a significant event, which is a requirement of their registration. This relates to the provider not informing Ofsted of a change to the person managing the setting. This was discussed with the provider and we are satisfied with their explanation. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services

we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years.
