

## Compliance action taken for childcare provision

## Summary of outcome

Her Majesty's Chief Inspector of Education, Children's Services and Skills is leading Ofsted's work into how regulated early years and childcare providers in England have delivered childcentred practice and care, within the context of the restrictions placed on society during the COVID-19 (coronavirus) pandemic.

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the <u>Statutory framework for</u> <u>the early years foundation stage</u>. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 16 October 2019, we carried out an inspection and found the provider was not meeting some of these requirements. The overall effectiveness of the provision was judged to be inadequate. The inspection report sets out the actions the provider was asked to take to meet the requirements.

On 9 October 2020, while routine inspections were suspended, we carried out an interim visit. The focus of the visit was to check whether the provider had met the safeguarding and welfare actions, raised at their last inspection.

We found that the manager has sought advice and guidance from local authority advisers and now has a better understanding of up-to-date early years legislation. She has reviewed the management of the setting and now ensures there is always a member of staff on-site who is capable to take charge in her absence. Staff have received training to improve their knowledge and understanding of wider safeguarding issues, including the 'Prevent' duty guidance. The designated safeguarding lead responsible for safeguarding in the nursery has completed relevant training. She ensures that she is always contactable to fulfil the requirements of this role. Staff now benefit from effective support and mentoring. They have attended a range of training courses to build on their professional development. This has improved their confidence and understanding of their key roles. The manager has reviewed record-keeping and can now provide evidence that there is always at least one person who is trained in first working on-site.

We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

## **Publication of compliance action**



We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years.
