

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the 'Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage', which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 20 August 2019 we carried out an inspection and found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements of the early years foundation stage. The overall effectiveness of the provision was judged to be inadequate. We served a welfare requirement notice. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take action. The inspection report sets out the actions the provider was required to take to meet the requirements.

On 24 September 2019 we visited the provider to check compliance with the actions listed in the welfare requirement notice issued at the inspection. The provider also sent us a copy of their action plan and the steps they had taken. It was found that the provider had taken action by improving the policies and procedures to safeguard children and putting effective recruitment arrangements in place. Staff had undergone training and there were new supervision arrangements to provide further support and coaching for staff. We also found that staff managed children's behaviour well and met children's needs during the visit. We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised at the last inspection.

The provider will be able to give parents further information about this. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.'
