

Complaint about childcare provision

Summary of outcome

Her Majesty's Chief Inspector of Education, Children's Services and Skills is leading Ofsted's work into how regulated early years and childcare providers in England have delivered child-centred practice and care, within the context of the restrictions placed on society during the COVID-19 (coronavirus) pandemic.

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the [Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage](#). If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 01 February 2021, we received concerns that the provider was not meeting some of these requirements.

On 09 February 2021 and 17 February 2021, we carried out a regulatory telephone call. We found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements and had taken action to put this right. The provider has taken steps to ensure that staff verify children are wearing appropriate clothing when playing outdoors and are clean and dry when they come inside. The provider has ensured that staff understand the importance of meeting children's health needs when they are playing outside and when they move between indoor and outdoor spaces.

The provider will be able to give parents further information about this. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.
