

## **Compliance action taken for childcare provision**

### **Summary of outcome**

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the [Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage](#). If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

Whilst routine and assurance inspections of early years and childcare provision remain suspended during COVID-19 pandemic, we are continuing with early years regulatory work. We interviewed the provider on 12 February 2021. We found the provider had not kept Ofsted informed about new staff as they join this setting. We issued an actions letter.

The provider has now taken appropriate action and the new staff have provided Ofsted with the necessary information to complete the vetting checks. The provider remains registered with Ofsted.

### **Publication of compliance action**

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years.
