Information about this children's home

This is a privately owned children's home.

The home provides care for up to four children who have emotional and/or behavioural difficulties.

There is no registered manager in post. The post has been vacant since 31 January 2021.

Inspection date: 9 March 2021

This monitoring visit

Routine inspection activity is currently suspended because of the COVID-19 (coronavirus) pandemic. A monitoring visit was carried out to ensure that children remain safe. The visit was carried out by two inspectors.

During this visit, the inspectors observed warm and friendly relationships between the children and staff. Children told the inspectors that they like living at the home. Children described good relationships with the staff team and each other. Children said that they understand what staff need to do to keep them safe. For example, children understand that staff supervise them if they go out in the community.

One child's social worker told the inspector that she 'can't believe' how well her child is doing. She said that staff are nurturing and that this has helped her child make progress and settle in the home.

Children's risks assessments include the relevant details and strategies for staff to manage and reduce risk. This is effective because children's risks have reduced. For example, this is in respect of incidents when children are missing from home. However, the inspectors identified some shortfalls in children's risk assessments because they do not include all current risks. This is specifically in relation to internet

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usage. The provider identified that this information was missing prior to the visit. The interim manager had started to make changes to risk assessments to reflect internet usage for children.

Not all staff know what is included in all children's risk assessments. One member of staff told inspectors that she hadn't read all the children's risk assessments. This is necessary to ensure that staff can safely care for children. Furthermore, the manager needs to ensure that all staff have sufficient knowledge and skills in respect of drug misuse.

There have been staff changes across the organisation, and a new manager recently started at the home. He was previously registered as a manager for another children's home within the organisation. He told the inspectors that he is in the process of completing an application to manage this children's home.

The interim manager's monitoring and review systems need to improve. This is specifically in relation to recording, reviewing and evaluating all relevant information in relation to children. This is necessary to ensure that he continually reviews the impact that the care is having on the progress and experiences of children.

The statement of purpose is not sent to Ofsted in line with regulation. This means that Ofsted does not have the most up-to-date information in respect of the children's home.
