

Complaint about childcare provision

Summary of outcome

Her Majesty's Chief Inspector of Education, Children's Services and Skills is leading Ofsted's work into how regulated early years and childcare providers in England have delivered childcentred practice and care, within the context of the restrictions placed on society during the COVID-19 (coronavirus) pandemic.

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 15 March 2021, we received concerns that the provider was not meeting some of these requirements.

On 19 March 2021, we carried out a regulatory visit. We found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements. We have issued actions for the provider to take. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Actions needed by 30 March 2021:

ensure that outdoor activities are planned and taken on a daily basis

take all reasonable steps to ensure staff and children are not exposed to risks, with specific regard for the bramble bush growing through the fence into the garden.

The provider remains registered with Ofsted.
