

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the 'Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage', which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right. On 26 February 2020 we carried out an inspection. The overall effectiveness of the provision was judged to be inadequate. The inspection report sets out the actions the provider was required to take to meet the requirements. We have served a welfare requirements notice. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Action required

ensure that all staff are alert to any signs for concerns in a child's home life or elsewhere, and that staff can follow the procedures in place to manage any child protection issues, including the accurate recording of signs of concern so that these can be monitored by 20 April 2020

make sure that staffing arrangements meet children's needs and ensure their safety; this is with specific regard to making sure that children are cared for by staff who know and understand their needs and that all staff follow established procedures for supervising children throughout the nursery by 20 April 2020

ensure that effective steps are taken to identify, reduce or minimise risks to children; this is with specific reference to ensuring that any information relating to children's care needs is taken into account when assessing potential hazards to children in the nursery by 20 April 2020

ensure that staff understand and can follow established procedures to respond to any allegations made against people who work with children by 20 April 2020

On 2 May 2020 we carried out a regulatory telephone call to the setting and on 9 September 2020, we carried out a regulatory visit. The focus of the call and visit was to check whether the provider had met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised at their last inspection.

The provider was found to be meeting the safeguarding and welfare actions. For example staff have all attended training to improve their knowledge and understanding of child

protection and are able to clearly explain action to take to keep children safe. Staff are now deployed to meet children's needs and have taken to manage risks to children.

Our next step will be to complete a re-inspection of the setting when routine inspections resume.
