Information about this children's home

The home is a privately run children's home. It provides care and accommodation for up to two children aged between eight and 17 years old.

The manager registered with Ofsted in January 2021.

Inspection date: 31 March 2021

This monitoring visit

Due to the restrictions in place relating to the COVID-19 (coronavirus) pandemic, this monitoring visit was carried out off site. The visit was undertaken to investigate potential breaches of regulations, after information was shared with Ofsted in notifications that indicated a potential risk of harm to children. The visit included a review of documents, a virtual tour of the building and discussions with children, staff and relevant professionals.

Children have made significant progress from their starting points. One child is now engaging in full-time education and is starting to make positive plans for the future. Another child's missing episodes have significantly reduced in number. This is a direct result of the support that children receive from staff and external agencies.

Children live in a homely environment and have a sense of belonging. Each child has their own bedroom that is personalised to reflect their interests. The overall state of repair and quality of decor, furnishings, fixtures and equipment are good. This helps to ensure that the home is comfortable and a welcoming place to live.

The manager has good oversight of the home and is proactive in identifying and addressing areas for development in staff practice. This helps to drive improvements in the quality of care provided for children.

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The manager has detailed oversight of restraint records. She ensures that debriefs take place with staff, and that any lessons learned are shared with the team. The manager also consults with the clinical team to develop new ways of working. This has helped to improve how staff respond to children's risky behaviours.

Risk management plans are confusing and do not include all of the known risks. These plans do not provide staff with clear guidance on how to keep children safe, and contain conflicting information. This lack of clarity has the potential to lead to conflicting practice by staff.

Management oversight of agency staff members is not robust. For example, it is not clear what training agency staff have completed, thus making it difficult for the manager to assess their suitability to work with the children. In addition, on one occasion, an agency staff member was involved in a physical restraint of a child. This is not in keeping with agreed policy and procedures. This is not good practice and has the potential to have a negative impact on children's safety.

Not all staff have the training to meet the children's identified needs. They have not all completed the mandatory training and it is unclear from the records what training the staff have had. There has been limited additional training or support put in place to mitigate the lack of face-to-face training that has resulted from the COVID-19 pandemic. This means that not all staff have the skills needed to support the children.

The staffing levels now in place are sufficient to meet the needs of the children. Interim measures have been implemented. This includes using the same staff from other homes and the same agency workers. This has helped to maintain consistency for the children.

The requirements made at the previous inspection are met.

Statutory requirements

helps children aspire to fulfil their potential; and promotes their welfare.	
In particular, the standard in paragraph (1) requires the registered person to—	



ensure that staff have the experience, qualifications and skills to meet the needs of each child. (Regulation 13 (1)(a)(b) (2)(c))

This specifically relates to all staff, including agency staff, completing all mandatory training, and training on child sexual exploitation and self-harm.
