Information about this children's home

This home is owned and managed by a private provider. It is registered to provide care and accommodation for up to five children who may have emotional and/or social difficulties and/or learning disabilities.

The home registered with Ofsted in February 2017. There is currently no registered manager in post.

This monitoring visit

The purpose of the visit was to monitor the provider's compliance with enforcement action, including a review of the restriction of accommodation. The visit took place on site, and included a review of documents, a tour of the home and discussions with staff.

This home was last visited on 6 April 2021, when a monitoring visit took place. Following this visit, the restriction of accommodation order remained in place. Two compliance notices were served under regulations 12 and 13 to address serious concerns. These related to ineffective processes for ensuring that the home is safely maintained, and widespread failings in the leadership and management of the home. A further five requirements were issued to address other shortfalls.

The responsible individual has followed safer recruitment processes during the appointment of a manager. The manager is in the process of submitting an application to be registered with Ofsted. She is completing an induction and getting to know her team. There are currently no children living in the home.

Most of the care staff are currently furloughed. Those who remain have completed health and safety training, which has been discussed further in practical sessions to embed this knowledge and upskill the team. A system has been put in place so that the staff can complete routine checks of the home. The staff record the outcomes of

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these checks and escalate any issues of concern. The staff demonstrate an understanding of their roles and responsibilities, including their role in maintaining a safe environment and how this helps them to keep children safe.

Staff have either completed or are enrolled on a suitable childcare course. Staff have completed all mandatory training, plus additional training that has included how to support children with a learning disability. The staff have expanded their knowledge so that they can become more proficient and effective in helping children.

The responsible individual has provided each member of staff with an appraisal and she has a system in place to ensure that these are carried out at regular intervals in the future Staff have been supported to reflect on their practice. They have had their training needs identified and they each have an individualised development plan. This means that there is now an effective monitoring and appraisal system in place which helps leaders to ensure that children are provided with safe care.

Following this visit, the compliance notices are met and the restriction of accommodation has been lifted. The requirement previously issued under regulation 6, relating to completion of the refurbishment of the home, is reissued as this has not been fully met. However, the responsible individual has a suitable ongoing programme of work in place, which is nearing completion. The previously issued requirements under regulations 5, 8 and 45 were not reviewed during this visit. For this reason, they are reissued.

Statutory requirements

The registered person must complete a review of the quality of care provided for children ("a quality of care review") at least once every 6 months.

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In order to complete a quality of care review the registered person must establish and maintain a system for monitoring, reviewing and evaluating—

the quality of care provided for children;

the feedback and opinions of children about the children's home, its facilities and the quality of care they receive in it; and

any actions that the registered person considers necessary in order to improve or maintain the quality of care provided for children.

After completing a quality of care review, the registered person must produce a written report about the quality of care review and the actions which the registered person intends to take as a result of the quality of care review ("the quality of care review report").

The registered person must—

supply to HMCI a copy of the quality of care review report within 28 days of the date on which the quality of care review is completed; and

make a copy of the quality of care review report available on request to a placing authority, if the placing authority is not the parent of a child accommodated in the home.

The system referred to in paragraph (2) must provide for ascertaining and considering the opinions of children, their parents, placing authorities and staff. (Regulation 45 (1) (2)(a)(b)(c) (3) (4)(a)(b) (5))
