Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The provider demonstrates a commitment to providing a high-quality service and has addressed the actions raised at the previous inspection. She describes how she evaluates her provision and obtains the views of staff, parents and children to continuously improve her practice.
- The provider has high expectations of all children and understands the importance of providing an inclusive service. She demonstrates a positive attitude towards promoting the diversity of cultures from the local community. She knows how to support children with special educational needs and/or disabilities.
- The provider demonstrates a secure knowledge of how children learn. She knows how to plan activities that reflect the needs and interests of children who attend the setting. She understands how to promote children's health. She describes how children are provided with good opportunities that promote their physical and emotional well-being, and the importance of providing children with a healthy, balanced diet.
- The provider describes how she promotes children's positive behaviour at the setting. She understands the importance of giving children clear boundaries and how to teach them to be kind and respectful to others.
- The provider understands the importance of working in partnership with parents and local schools. She describes how she obtains and exchanges information with them to help staff to understand and meet the individual needs of children.
- The provider, who is also the designated safeguarding lead, understands her responsibilities to keep children safe. She has kept her safeguarding knowledge up to date and demonstrates a secure understanding of the wider aspects of safeguarding such as the 'Prevent' duty and female genital mutilation. Robust policies and risk assessments for the premises are in place. Appropriate checks are carried out to ensure that staff are suitable to work with children.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- This was the first routine inspection the provider received since the COVID-19 (coronavirus) pandemic began. The inspector discussed the impact of the pandemic with the provider and has taken that into account in their evaluation of the provider.
- The inspector met with the provider to talk about the suitability of the premises, how the club is organised and to check that all legal requirements are met.
- A range of documentation was viewed by the inspector, including safeguarding policies and procedures and paediatric first-aid qualifications.



We carried out this inspection under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.

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
