

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

Her Majesty's Chief Inspector or Education, Children's Services and Skills is leading Ofsted's work into how regulated early years and childcare providers in England have delivered childcentred practice and care, within the context of the restrictions placed on society during the COVID-10 (coronavirus) pandemic.

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the 'Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage', which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 11 May 2021, we received concerns that this provider was not meeting some of these requirements.

On 13 May 2021, the provider notified Ofsted of an incident where a child sustained an injury.

On 21 May 2021, we carried out an unannounced visit to the nursery. We found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements.

We issued a notice to improve. This notice required the provider to take the action below within the timescale set out. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Action needed by 30 July 2021:

- ensure to comply with requirements of health and safety legislation, including fire safety.
- maintain a valid information commissioner's office certificate is to ensure information and records about staff and children are held securely.

We are satisfied with the action taken by the provider.



Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.
