

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

Her Majesty's Chief Inspector of Education, Children's Services and Skills is leading Ofsted's work into how regulated early years and childcare providers in England have delivered childcentred practice and care within the context of the restrictions placed on society during the COVID-19 (coronavirus) pandemic.

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at http://www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework.

If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 25 June 2021 the provider notified us of a safeguarding concern. The notification means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage.

On 29 July 2021, we carried out a regulatory telephone call. We found that the provider was not meeting some of the requirements. We have issued actions for the provider to take. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Action needed by 12 August 2021:

take action to make sure that all staff have a clear understanding of their roles and responsibilities with regard to supervising children and keeping them safe

ensure staff are deployed effectively to keep children within sight and hearing, and always within sight or hearing, at all times.

We will monitor the provider's response to ensure that the action is successfully completed.

The provider responded to our actions letter by 10 August 2021. We found that the provider had taken appropriate action.

Publication of compliance action



We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years.
