### Information about this children's home

This service is operated by a private provider and provides care and accommodation for two children who have learning disabilities.

Inspection date: 22 July 2021

## This monitoring visit

On 28 and 29 April 2021, Ofsted undertook a full inspection. The home was judged inadequate. In response to that visit, Ofsted issued a notice of restriction of accommodation. On 14 June 2021, a monitoring visit took place to monitor the notice of restriction. This had been adhered to and remained in place. In addition, on 21 May 2021, a notice of proposal to cancel the registration of the home was issued.

The purpose of this visit was to consider the home's adherence to the notice of restriction. The provider has adhered to the restriction of accommodation and there are currently no children living at the home.

The home remains without a manager and staff team. As a result, the management and staffing arrangements continue to be inadequate and it would be unsafe for children to be admitted to the home.

The provider has recruited to its senior leadership team. Despite this, since the last inspection on 14 June 2021 little progress has been made to address the shortfalls identified at the full inspection in April 2021. Furthermore, four new regulatory breaches were identified.

The condition of the home has not been improved. The office door is damaged, an annual gas check had not been completed, and recommendations in the fire risk assessment that was completed in April 2021 have not been actioned.

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Monthly independent visits are now being completed. However, these have not been sent to Ofsted. The quality-of-care review has not been completed. The lack of monitoring and review systems in place does not provide Ofsted with assurance about the leadership of the home.

The home's location risk assessment has not been reviewed or updated. This was not identified as being out of date by the senior leadership team until it was requested by the inspector during the monitoring visit.

All but two of the previous requirements remain in place due to the lack of progress. However, the home's statement of purpose has been updated and a safeguarding policy has been devised.

Following this monitoring inspection, Ofsted issued a further notice of restriction of accommodation.
