Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- Practitioners understand the interests of children in the early years age range. They know how to plan activities to help children learn about people who may be different from themselves. The setting offers a wide range of toys and resources for children to choose from.
- Managers understand the importance of working with parents and teachers to ensure continuity and consistency for children. Parents who took part in a recent survey commented that staff are 'very professional and reassuring'. Managers have maintained contact with parents and practitioners via email throughout the COVID-19 (coronavirus) pandemic.
- Managers and practitioners undertake regular safeguarding training and have a firm understanding of how to protect children from harm. They recognise the signs that indicate a child might be at risk and know the action they should take. Safe recruitment procedures are in place to ensure adults working with children are suitable to do so. The induction programme ensures that practitioners are well prepared for their roles.
- Managers have put into place all necessary procedures to promote children's health and well-being. Practitioners understand the procedures for the safe administration of medicines. A range of healthy snacks are offered. Practitioners recognise the importance of good allergy management. The provider follows COVID-19 (coronavirus) safety guidelines.
- Practitioners have worked together at the setting for many years. They have appropriate childcare qualifications and have access to many relevant training courses. They feel well supported by their colleagues and management team.
- Managers talk passionately about their vision for the setting and their aim for all children to feel included and valued. They understand the importance of positive behaviour management strategies, which enable children to feel included and part of their community.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Information about this early years setting

Rosewood After School Club registered in 2017. It operates from the grounds of Alexander McLeod Primary School in Abbey Wood, in the London Borough of Greenwich and caters only for children attending the school. The club is open each weekday during term time only. The breakfast club runs from 7.30am to 8.50am and the after-school club runs from 3.15pm to 6pm. The club employs seven staff. There are two managers who each hold a childcare qualification at level 3. All other staff hold relevant childcare qualifications.

Inspection activities

- This was the first routine inspection the provider received since the COVID-19 (coronavirus) pandemic began. The inspector discussed the impact of the pandemic with the provider and has taken that into account in their evaluation of the provider.
- The inspector viewed the responses to a recent parent survey conducted by the provider and considered the views expressed there.
- The manager and inspector completed a tour of the premises together.
- Practitioners spoke to the inspector about the activities they provide for children and the support they receive from the management team.
- The inspector viewed a range of relevant documentation including practitioners' suitability records, first-aid certificates and qualifications.
