Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The provider ensures that staff attend regular training to help them to recognise when a child may be at risk. Staff demonstrate a good understanding of how to identify the signs of abuse, including wider safeguarding issues, such as grooming and exploitation. The provider and staff are confident on the procedures to follow if they are concerned about the well-being of a child.
- The provider recognises the benefits of working in partnership with parents and others involved in children's care, to ensure children receive consistent support.
- The provider understands the importance of evaluating the provision to identify areas for improvement. He is committed to ensuring that staff keep their knowledge and skills up to date. For example, staff attend regular training to help guide and improve their practice.
- The provider understands the importance of promoting healthy lifestyle habits, such as children eating well-balanced meals and having regular physical activity.
- The provider recognises his role in teaching children to value and respect others. He acknowledges the importance of setting clear boundaries to help guide children's behaviour.
- The provider acknowledges the importance of completing regular risk assessments on the premises, and teaching children how to keep themselves safe.
- The provider has a wide range of age-appropriate resources and play materials.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- This was the first routine inspection the setting received since the COVID-19 pandemic began. The inspector discussed the impact of the pandemic with the setting and has taken that into account in their evaluation of the setting.
- The inspector sampled a range of documentation, including paediatric first-aid certificate and public liability insurance.
- The inspector asked staff questions throughout the inspection to establish their understanding of how to safeguard children.
- A meeting was held with the provider to establish their understanding of the early years foundation stage and how they ensure they meet the statutory requirements.
- The inspector viewed the areas of the provision used by children.

We carried out this inspection under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.

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
