

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 16 August 2021, we carried out an inspection and found the provider was not meeting some of these requirements. The overall effectiveness of the provision was judged to be inadequate. The inspection report sets out the actions the provider was required to take to meet the requirements.

On 27 August 2021 we carried out a regulatory telephone call. The focus of the call was to check whether the provider had met the safeguarding and welfare actions and learning and development actions, raised at their last inspection.

We found that the provider had completed a risk assessment of her home to ensure it was safe and suitable, she had tidied her home to ensure there is enough space for children to move around, she had improved her menu planning and ensured food is prepared hygienically. The provider had improved her planning to ensure children's individual needs and interests are met.

We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare actions and the learning and development action raised. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years.
