

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 14 July 2021, we carried out an inspection and found the provider was not meeting some of these requirements. The overall effectiveness of the provision was judged to be inadequate. The inspection report sets out the actions the provider was required to take to meet the requirements.

On 22 September 2021, we carried out a regulatory visit. The focus of the visit was to check whether the provider had met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised at their last inspection.

We found that the staff had improved their safeguarding knowledge and are able to identify if a child is at risk of being exposed to extreme views and behaviours. Staff are also aware of female genital mutilation and what to do if they have concerns about this. Systems are in place to identify any risks and action is taken to minimise these risks. The deputy manager has completed risk assessment training to assist them in their role as health and safety lead. Staff practice is monitored by the manager and members of the committee through observations and meetings with staff. Procedures are in place for staff to monitor each other's practice and feedback to improve practice.

We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.
