## Summary of key findings

### This provision meets requirements

- Leaders and staff know how to meet children's individual needs and interests. They understand how to provide a range of activities and experiences at the club to support these. This includes regular access to outdoor play and giving children opportunities to choose their own experiences.
- Leaders and staff understand how to support good behaviour and help children to be considerate and respectful of others. They recognise the importance of supporting children's understanding of diversity and of healthy lifestyles.
- Leaders are aware of the importance of working in partnership with parents and with the school that children also attend. They know to encourage two-way communication with parents and teachers about children's welfare and experiences.
- Leaders understand the need to evaluate the provision and develop staff skills. They know how to supervise staff and support their professional development. For example, there is a thorough induction programme for new staff and well-tailored ongoing training.
- Leaders and staff fully understand the safeguarding and welfare requirements and keep up to date with current legislation. They know how to recognise any signs of potential abuse and the procedures to follow if they have any child protection concerns.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

- A sample of documentation was viewed by the inspector, including children's records, staff qualifications and staff suitability.
- The inspector spoke with leaders and staff about their role and understanding of safeguarding.
