Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- Since the last inspection and subsequent visits from Ofsted, the manager ensures she and her staff implement the statutory requirements to meet children's needs.
- The manager understands the importance of checking the safety of the premises, equipment and resources. She demonstrates how she meets the correct staff-to-child ratios, minimises risks and explains the actions she takes to keep children safe.
- Safeguarding is effective. The manager and staff are alert to possible signs and symptoms of abuse. They have completed child protection training and keep their knowledge and understanding up to date by doing online research and regular quizzes to test each other. They demonstrate secure knowledge and understanding of how to protect children from harm. Written policies and procedures are in place and include the contact details of relevant local agencies available for use, if needed.
- The manager explains how she develops good relationships with parents and others who are involved in children's care, such as staff at schools. She recognises the importance of regular communication and exchange of information to aid consistency and to help meet children's needs effectively.
- The manager and staff understand the importance of promoting values and respect. They provide activities and experiences to raise children's awareness of similarities and differences and encourage understanding of varied cultures.
- The manager explains that older children who attend the club are polite, well behaved and considerate. Staff show how they encourage children to make friends with those from different schools and year groups. For example, together they set up group games and activities that they can all participate in.
- The manager has all required information and records in place. This includes records of all the checks she has completed to assure staff's suitability. The manager is keen to improve the quality of the club. Staff attend training to promote their professional development and they regularly review the provision with the manager, including input from parents and older children.
- Since the COVID-19 pandemic, additional health and safety measures have been introduced. Children are taken out to their parents at collection time to minimise the amount of people inside and help reduce the risk of infection.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
