

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 23 August 2021, we carried out an inspection and found the provider was not meeting some of these requirements. The overall effectiveness of the provision was judged to be inadequate. The inspection report sets out the actions the provider was required to take to meet the requirements.

On 16 September 2021, we carried out a regulatory visit. The focus of the visit was to check whether the provider had met the safeguarding and welfare actions, raised at their last inspection.

We found that the provider has implemented effective systems to ensure that practitioners, and any other person who is likely to have regular contact with children, are deemed suitable. Appropriate risk assessment practice is carried out and any risks to children have been minimised or removed. Systems for staff deployment have been reviewed and staff were deployed effectively to keep children safe. The key-person system has been developed to ensure children receive tailored care and learning experiences. Parent partnerships have been developed further. The provider has implemented a range of strategies for parents and staff to exchange information. Arrangements have improved for children who may have special educational needs and/or disabilities. Staff follow focused care and learning plans to support these children. The provider ensures that staff received sufficient supervision, support and training to enhance their practice. The provider has reviewed all required documentation and now ensures that records, including those relating to accident and injury, are sufficiently detailed. Hygiene practices have been reviewed and are now implemented effectively to promote children's good health.

We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.
