

## **Compliance action taken for childcare provision**

### **Summary of outcome**

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at [www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2](http://www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2). If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 12 October 2021, we carried out an inspection and found the provider was not meeting some of these requirements.

The report and inspection outcome will be published in due course. Following the inspection, we served a welfare requirements notice on 19 October 2021. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

Actions needed by 29 October 2021:

- improve knowledge and understanding of safeguarding responsibilities, including the procedures to follow when there are concerns about children and how to support children's learning in how to keep themselves safe
- improve knowledge and understanding of the early years foundation stage to be able to meet all requirements and provide children with good quality care and education
- develop understanding of the role of the key person in order to know enough about children to be able to meet their individual learning and care needs, as well as their cultural and dietary requirements
- ensure fresh drinking water is available and accessible to children at all times.

On 1 November 2021, we carried out a regulatory visit. The focus of the visit was to check whether the provider had met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised at their last inspection. We found the provider had taken some action towards meeting the safeguarding and welfare actions. For example, the provider had read up on their roles and responsibilities, is being supported by the local authority and explained how they will ensure children will always have access to fresh drinking water. However, progress towards meeting the requirements was limited.

On 17 November 2021, the provider resigned their registration. The provider is no longer registered with Ofsted.
