## Summary of key findings

### This provision meets requirements

- The provider understands his role in keeping children safe. He ensures that staff have regular training to help them to recognise when a child may be at risk of harm. Staff have a good knowledge of what to do if they are concerned about a child. They can confidently describe the indicators that a child may be at risk of harm, including wider safeguarding concerns, such as exploitation and extremism.
- The provider understands the importance of having robust recruitment and vetting procedures in place to ensure that staff working with children are suitable. Staff regularly extend their knowledge and skills, such as through completing regular training.
- The provider acknowledges the importance of providing an inclusive environment, where all children, including those with special educational needs and disabilities, are welcomed.
- The provider recognises the benefits of working with parents and other settings that children attend to ensure children receive consistent support.
- The provider and staff recognise their role in teaching children to respect and value others. They understand the importance of setting clear boundaries and having positive strategies to help guide children's behaviour.
- The provider recognises the importance of promoting healthy lifestyle habits, such as ensuring children follow robust hygiene practices and benefit from plenty of physical activity and fresh air.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
