# **Summary of key findings**

#### This provision meets requirements

- The manager understands how to plan activities for children that engage their interest. Staff make sure children have a good selection of resources to choose from. The manager is committed to creating an environment where children flourish, feel safe and are happy.
- The management team evaluate the service they provide. They seek feedback from parents and children. They use this to help identify the strengths and weaknesses of the club.
- There are clear roles and responsibilities that help ensure the club runs efficiently and safely. Staff plan activities that cater for the variety of age ranges and requirements of the children attending.
- The area manager conducts regular visits, where staff are observed interacting with the children. Staff are encouraged to evaluate their own knowledge and skills in order to identify any specific training needs. Senior managers understand the importance of regular training to ensure staff understand wider safeguarding issues, and their roles and responsibilities in keeping children safe.
- The manager recognises the importance of building good relationships and working partnerships with the school and parents. This means children experience consistent approaches in the different settings they attend. Children then know what is expected from them and how to behave appropriately.
- The manager has systems in place to risk assess the environment and activities on offer at the club. He carefully considers any possible risks and puts measures in place to help promote the safety of children.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

- The inspector looked at relevant documents and reviewed evidence of the suitability of all persons working on the premises.
- The manager showed the inspector around the club and explained how the play environment is organised.
