

## Compliance action taken for childcare provision

## **Summary of outcome**

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 14 October 2021, we carried out an inspection and found the provider was not meeting some of these requirements. The overall effectiveness of the provision was judged to be inadequate. The inspection report sets out the actions the provider was required to take to meet the requirements.

On 29 October 2021, we carried out a regulatory visit. The focus of the visit was to check whether the provider had met the safeguarding and welfare actions, raised at their last inspection.

We found that the provider took steps to ensure all staff, including leaders and managers, are suitable to meet the requirements of their roles. The manager has enhanced arrangements for support, supervision and professional development for staff, to help improve the quality of education for children. Leaders and managers took immediate steps to ensure there is an adequate number of staff to work directly with children and supervise them at all times, particularly during mealtimes. The provider took steps to improve staff's knowledge of good hygiene practices. The management team checks these are followed consistently to reduce the risk of cross-infection and promote children's good health.

The management team ensure leaders and staff record every first-aid treatment given to a child following an incident and information is readily available to those who need to see it. Leaders and managers have improved risk assessment procedures to identify hazards and ensure staff and children are not exposed to risks within the environment. Furthermore, the management team ensures there are suitable arrangements in place to support children with special educational needs and/ or disabilities in a timely manner, to help them make the best possible progress.

We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.
