Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows how to promote children's safety in her home and during outings to minimise accidents and injuries. The childminder's home is free from hazards.
- The childminder recognises the importance of working in partnership with parents and other professionals to support children's care and learning.
- The childminder has addressed the actions raised at her last inspection. She has attended training to enhance her practice and make improvements to what she can provide for children. Further focus is required to ensure that improvements are sustained.
- The childminder has a good understanding of safeguarding and is able to identify signs and symptoms of abuse, including wider safeguarding concerns such as the 'Prevent' duty. She is aware of her role and responsibility to safeguard children and knows who to contact should she have any concerns regarding children's safety or welfare.
- The childminder knows how to promote children's health and physical well-being through daily routines and providing healthy snacks.
- The childminder has a good understanding of how to positively manage children's behaviour. She places a value in supporting children with their emotions, so that they have a better understanding of themselves and others.
- The childminder has sufficient knowledge of how children learn. She understands the importance of quality teaching.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
