Summary of key findings

This provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder does not have a valid first-aid certificate in place.
- The childminder does not have public liability insurance in place.
- The childminder knows how to risk assess her home to ensure that the premises are safe and suitable for children. She identifies potential hazards and recognises the importance of minimising these risks to children. For example, she ensures hazardous items and substances are kept out of reach of children.
- The childminder comprehends the early years foundation stage requirements (EYFS). She understands how children learn and she plans her curriculum with this in mind. She demonstrates, through discussion, the role of observations and assessment to identify where children are in their learning so that she can plan for the next stage in their development.
- The childminder knows how to safeguard children and keep them safe. She knows the correct procedures to follow if she has concerns about children's welfare. She is familiar with current legislation and guidance, such as children who may be at risk of radicalisation and female genital mutilation.
- The childminder understands how to work in partnership with parents to ensure continuity of children's care. She knows how to gather appropriate information when children first start to cater for their individual needs.
- The childminder explains how she supports children's independence and encourages them to learn to take appropriate risks for themselves. The childminder understands the importance of providing children with ageappropriate boundaries as they learn to manage their own behaviour.
- The childminder explains how she reviews her practice. She shows relevant documentation and has mandatory policies in place.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
