Summary of key findings

This provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder has not completed mandatory paediatric first-aid training, to keep her skills updated in order to keep children safe. In addition, the contents of the first-aid box are incomplete, with several items that are out of date. These are breaches of the safeguarding and welfare requirements
- The childminder does not have a secure enough knowledge and understanding of safeguarding to keep children safe. She does not fully understand the action to take when there are concerns about a child or in the event of an allegation being made against herself or adults who may have contact with the child. Furthermore, she has not kept herself up to date with local procedures to safeguard children.
- The childminder explains, through discussion, how she considers children's interests and needs. However, she does not use her observations and assessments of children to check their progress and to identify the next steps in their learning. Furthermore, the childminder does not fully understand the requirement to complete the progress check for children between the ages of two and three years. Therefore she does not complete it.
- The childminder's poor knowledge of child development, and how children learn, limits her ability to provide a broad curriculum to support children's individual learning and development.
- Through discussion, the childminder understands how to support children's emotional well-being and positive relationships. She has satisfactory knowledge of behaviour management and discusses the strategies she will put in place to encourage children to be polite and respectful to each other.
- The childminder is aware of the importance of a healthy lifestyle. She explains how she will provide healthy and nutritious snacks for children. For example, she demonstrates how she will provide parents with guidance about healthy foods to put in their children's lunch boxes.
- The childminder intends to provide plenty opportunities to take children out on a daily basis for fresh air and exercise. She plans to take the children on outings to local parks, playgroups, the seaside and farms.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

What does the setting need to do to improve?

To meet the requirements of the early years foundation stage and Childcare Register the provider must:

Inspection activities
