## Summary of key findings

### This provision meets requirements

- The management team understand how to plan to provide an enjoyable range of activities for all children at the club, to help complement their day at school.
- The management team recognise the importance of self-evaluation to help them to identify any areas for improvement. Staff are provided with regular professional development opportunities to help them to update their knowledge.
- The management team is aware of the responsibility to protect children from harm. The team ensure that staff know the procedures to follow if they have a concern about a child's welfare and how to recognise potential signs and symptoms of abuse.
- The management team understand the importance of building effective partnerships with parents and the school. The team know to share information, to support children in all areas of their development and individual needs.
- The management team know how to support children to have opportunities to be physically active and to gain an awareness of making healthy choices.
- The management team acknowledge the importance of staff helping children to behave well and understand boundaries. Children are supported to help them to build on their social skills, to share and play with others.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Camp Glide breakfast and after school club operates from Merstham Primary School in Redhill, Surrey. The club is open Monday to Friday during term time from 7.30am until 9am and from 3.30pm until 6pm. The club employs four members of staff, one of whom holds a relevant qualification at level 5.

## Inspection activities

- This was the first routine inspection the setting received since the COVID-19 pandemic began. The inspector discussed the impact of the pandemic with the nominated individual and has taken that into account in their evaluation of the setting.
- A range of documentation was sampled, including suitability checks, policies and procedures, staff recruitment procedures and training.
- The inspector held discussions with the nominated individual and the manager about how they plan for different experiences and opportunities for children.
- Discussions were held with the manager and the nominated individual about their safeguarding knowledge and understanding, including the procedures they would use to report any concerns for a child's welfare.
- The inspector discussed the use of self-evaluation and the current areas identified for improvement. The inspector completed a learning walk with the nominated individual around the areas that school use for the breakfast and after-school provision.

We carried out this inspection under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.

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
