

## **Compliance action taken for childcare provision**

### **Summary of outcome**

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at [www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2](http://www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2). If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 27 October 2021, we received concerns that the provider was not meeting some of these requirements.

On 25 November 2021 and 9 December 2021, we carried out regulatory visits. We found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements. We have served a welfare requirements notice. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Actions needed by 20 December 2021:

- provide the required information to enable Ofsted to assess your ongoing suitability, specifically ensure the health form is shared with your GP to provide the information promptly
  
- ensure the premises are clean and tidy to provide a suitable environment for minded children, in particular, the kitchen and the main play areas.

We will monitor the provider's response to ensure the actions are successfully completed.

On 21 December 2021, we carried out a regulatory visit. The focus of the visit was to check whether the provider had met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised at their previous visit. We found that the provider had given the health form to their GP and had improved the tidiness and cleanliness of the premises, including the kitchen.

We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised.

Additionally, during the regulatory visit on 21 December 2021, we found new areas of concern. The provider's paediatric first-aid certificate has expired, although training has now been booked. This means that the provider was not meeting other requirements as set out in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage. In relation to the new areas of concern, on 21 December 2021, we issued actions for the provider to take.

Actions needed by 31 January 2022:

- ensure paediatric first-aid training is completed and that this is then kept updated in the future.

The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

### **Publication of compliance action**

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years.
