Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder's home is welcoming and well organised. She talks confidently about assessing risks, to help to provide a safe and hygienic environment for children. The childminder understands her duty to safeguard children and protect them from harm. She can recognise the possible signs and symptoms of abuse and knows how to report any concerns about children's welfare. The childminder attends safeguarding training regularly and holds a recognised paediatric first-aid qualification.
- The childminder describes how she will meet children's individual needs, such as, if they have a food allergy or a medical condition. She recognises the importance of working closely with parents to provide appropriate and consistent care and learning for their children.
- The childminder understands how young children learn and develop. She explains how she will monitor and support their progress through the early years foundation stage. The childminder has a good range of resources to support children's learning and development. She knows how to enhance children's interest in learning, such as by taking them on outings.
- The childminder knows how to support children to become independent and confident about what they can do. She understands how to manage children's behaviour appropriately and to teach them social skills, such as how to share and be kind.
- The childminder recognises the significance of ensuring that her service is welcoming and inclusive. She knows how to support children's positive awareness of differences between people. The childminder is keen to encourage children to develop respect for living things and their environment.
- The childminder knows how to promote children's physical health and wellbeing. For example, she explains how she will take children to the park for fresh air and exercise each day. The childminder understands the importance of children making positive choices, such as cleaning their teeth and eating healthily.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The childminder described how she will organise her provision, including the learning programmes for children.
- A range of documents, including the childminder's paediatric first-aid certificate and safeguarding policies were reviewed by the inspector.
