

## Compliance action taken for childcare provision

## **Summary of outcome**

Her Majesty's Chief Inspector of Education, Children's Services and Skills is leading Ofsted's work into how regulated early years and childcare providers in England have delivered childcentred practice and care, within the context of the restrictions placed on society during the COVID-19 (coronavirus) pandemic.

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 20 October 2021, we carried out an inspection and found the provider was not meeting some of these requirements. The overall effectiveness of the provision was judged to be inadequate. The inspection report sets out the actions the provider was required to take to meet the requirements.

On 24 November 2021, we carried out a regulatory visit. The focus of the visit was to check whether the provider had met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised at their last inspection.

We found that the provider has improved risk assessments to identify and remove all hazards to children. The provider has trained staff to understand the procedure to follow should they have a concern about a member of staff's conduct. Improvements have been made to the arrangement for supervision of staff. The provider has made improvements to support children who have special educational needs and/or disabilities. Each child now has a named key person. Information has been obtained from parents about children's individual health requirements. Hygiene procedures have been improved. Appropriate hand washing facilities are available, and children's equipment is clean. The provider has appointed a suitably qualified and experienced member of staff to take charge of the baby room.

We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.
