Information about this children's home

This home provides care for up to four children with emotional and/or behavioural difficulties. It is one of three homes that are run by a private organisation,

The manager registered with Ofsted in December 2021.

This monitoring visit

The provider voluntarily closed the home in May 2021 to make improvements to the home and restructure the staff team.

The purpose of the visit was to review the provider's request to lift the three-month condition and to assess the provider's readiness to reopen the home. The provider has made sufficient improvements to demonstrate that they are likely to meet children's needs.

The provider has met five out of the nine requirements raised at the last visit. The home now has sufficient staff to care for children in line with the home's statement of purpose. New staff have been recruited, and other staff have been redeployed from another home in the organisation. The current team comprises a positive blend of suitably experienced and qualified staff who are likely to provide consistent good-quality care and support to children.

Recruitment records are well maintained and meet requirements. Full employment history and verbal verification of references are now included as routine in the organisation's recruitment procedures. Strong recruitment procedures reduce the potential for unsuitable people to be employed at the home.

An experienced manager has registered with Ofsted. The provider has appointed an independent visitor. The provider has evidenced improved monitoring systems that give good scope to highlight areas of development to secure continuous

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improvement. Although not tested, this is likely to provide better scrutiny of practice and care.

The management team's internal monitoring activities have improved the clarity and accuracy of records maintained at the home. These activities include monitoring of staffing rotas and recruitment, supervision and appraisals records. Frameworks for care planning and risk assessment have been adapted and enhanced.

Staff members are supported to have regular and reflective supervision in line with the organisation's policy. New staff have planned inductions to help them begin to work with the children. The regular supervision and well-developed training are likely to equip staff with the skills to meet the individual needs of children.

The remaining requirements that were raised at the last visit were outside the scope of this visit and were not reviewed. These requirements are therefore restated and will be reviewed at the next inspection.

This was raised at the last visit and has been restated. 28 February 2022 The registered person must ensure that within 24 hours of the use of a measure of control, discipline or restraint in relation to a child in the home, a record is made which includes the name of the child; details of the child's behaviour leading to the use of the measure; the date, time and location of the use of the measure; a description of the measure and its duration; details of any methods used or steps taken to avoid the need to use the measure; the name of the person who used the measure ("the user"), and of any other person present when the measure was used: the effectiveness and any consequences of the use of the measure; and a description of any injury to the child or any other person, and any medical treatment administered, as a result of the measure; within 48 hours of the use of the measure, the registered person, or a person who is authorised by the registered person to do so ("the authorised person") has spoken to the user about the measure; and has signed the record to confirm it is accurate; and



within 5 days of the use of the measure, the registered person or the authorised person adds to the record confirmation that they have spoken to the child about the measure.
